 - Be sure to publicize the community plant exchange table (between 62nd & 63rd on Tibbits
 - Future action item: plan for a plant and tool swap for next year

- Brief discussion of publicizing the PSU heritage tree survey to neighbors with trees 100 years and older

Neighborhood Engagement:

Discussion of what would bring more people to STNA meetings and make the Association seem more vital

- Addresses for South Tabor info kiosks need to be collected & updated; revisit their purpose?
- USPS mailing prices/process needs to be researched
 - Determine content beyond publicizing the June 10 event (helpful safety tips,
- Survey of/for neighbors
 - Determine what issues might get them involved in STNA (safety, connection, dream businesses to lure to the neighborhood
 - Include questions that get at diversity (race-ethnicity, LGBTQ+, disability, age)
 - Plan more fun public meeting opportunities for in-person feedback about what neighbors want and what STNA is about
 - Better communication about what STNA is and does (not a home-owners association, not an arm of city government)

Diversity:

- Volunteers to draft neighborhood mailing to encourage more diverse people to attend & get involved in STNA: Juan, Cathy, Sandy, Toby?
- Committee needs a chair; Juan is filling in, but this would give him two board roles when we want to be expanding membership and participation

Miscellaneous:

• Board unanimously <u>approved</u> giving a PSU researcher access to info on STNA meeting attendance info for a demographics survey.

New Business:

- **Discussion on Community Safety (initiated by Toby):** Follow-up from the March meeting about rising crime in the neighborhood and questions about previous neighborhood watch programs.
- STNA reached out to the office of Civic Life about the "Safe Blocks" program. <u>Safe</u> <u>Blocks Program | Portland.gov</u> Looking for community members interested in potentially planning a training or event with the program.
- Need to get more people out of their houses and paying attention. Ideas included:

- Door to door?
- Events?
- Sharing contacts
- Creating a network of phone numbers, texts, doorbells people can reach out to when something happens
- Checking in on neighbors who are older
- Create a mailer/handout that would lead people to resources other than 911 and the police
- Discussed forming an ad-hoc committees on Public Safety and/or Engagement
- After discussion, the board agreed that the STNA's standing Events Committee overlapped with those areas because of goal of bringing more neighbors together; Toby was unanimously appointed as Events Committee Chair, with the understanding that actual event planning would be allocated to other STNA members.

Elections:

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to postpone board member elections from the May to the June meeting in the hopes that more community members would be present after the June 10 Garage Sale/Garden Visit event: chair and secretary are both up for election this year; John nominated Juan for chair and Cathy for secretary.

Future Meeting Locations: Looking to move around STNA meetings to draw more out of our community, while being mindful of locations that might be uninviting to some community members.

It was decided that Juan would see about booking the May 18 and June 15 meetings at the APANO community space (SW corner of 82nd & SE Division).

The meeting adjourned at 8:30PM.
